A 32& of theoretical BOD using an activated sludge inoculum was observed for octadecylamine over a 15-day incubation period(1), suggesting that biodegradation may be rapid in the environment(SRC).

### Mobility in soil

The Koc of octadecylamine is estimated as approximately 3.198X10+5(SRC), using an estimated log Kow of 7.7(1,SRC) and a regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(3), this estimated Koc value suggests that octadecylamine is expected to be immobile in soil(SRC).

#### Product
